Coconut Curried Sausages

Recipe of the Month Ingredients: 500g beef sausages, 1x brown onion diced, 1tbs crushed garlic, 2x carrots diced, 2x zucchini diced, 2 cups frozen peas, 1tbs turmeric, 1tbs curry power (more depending on how much curry you like) & 2x can coconut cream

Method: Boil sausages till cooked and skin falls off. Fry off in a small amount of oil with the onion, garlic, turmeric, and curry powder. Add in vegetables and coconut cream and simmer till all vegetables are cooked. Serve with rice.

Gee whiz, where has the year gone?! It's a struggle to comprehend that we are already in November and are starting to make plans for next month's Preschool Graduation. Due to the ever-shifting guidelines and unpredictable local case numbers, we are evaluating how best to make this happen and be accessible for children and their families. Please stay tuned for more information in the coming weeks.

> Wheel Week last week was an absolute smash hit and was enjoyed by all, resulting in fatigued class members all around! Thanks to all our families who were eager to have their child participate and allowing them to bring in their own set of wheels. We all had a wheely, wheely good time! Three of

the five days we managed to travel down to Murray Field, making it a four-kilometre round trip!

Science continues to be an interest, with several students requesting opportunities for constructing and erupting volcanoes. We have extended on these gueries by using the same ingredients and incorporating an ongoing curiosity about potions, by brewing our own "magic, colour changing potion!" Using liquid obtained by steeping chopped red cabbage in boiling water as an indicator and adding vinegar and lime juice (acid) and bicarb of soda (alkali) to the solution, class members marvelled at the instant colour changes and reaction.

JUNIOR PRESCHOOL NEWS

Welcome to our play and learning for October!

With the warmer weather children and educators have enjoyed lots of time outdoors. Creating different obstacle courses to challenge gross motor skills through managed risk-taking activities has been popular with all children. This is because they can participate at a level they are comfortable with, and as their confidence increases, tackle more complex movements. It's been fantastic to see more competent children demonstrate and guide their peers (scaffolding learning as they play 'follow the leader').







To build on this interest we reintroduced bike riding along the cycle path at the back of Yarrunga. We saw lots of different bikes and scooters being ridden, and once again a scaffolding of learning as children shared their wheels and attempted various riding skills with the help of their friends and teachers. The Nursery/Toddler group joined us with their push trollies and ride-on-toys too!







Each week a different room prepares afternoon tea for the whole centre, and we have noticed how much enjoyment our children are getting from these valuable learning experiences as they help measure, count, chop, grate, smell, taste and feel the ingredients. Grievance Policy

If parents have any concerns or complaints, please follow the attached Grievance Policy

1 Informal Resolution of Grievances

Initially any grievance raised will be approached in an informal manner.

(Informal Procedure for Resolution of Grievance). If required, an appointment

time with the Centre Director and/or

President of the Management Committee

Genna Richter (phone 0428109382) to discuss the grievance can be arranged.

2 Formal Resolution of Grievances

2.1 In the event informal processes are unable to be used or informal processes fail to achieve a satisfactory outcome for any of the parties involved in the grievance, the formal process will then be used. Determining whether the grievance will be handled formally is at the discretion of the Director/President of Management Committee based on feedback from the concerned parties at the conclusion of the informal stage (Formal Procedure for Resolution of Grievance).

2.2 When a formal resolution of grievance is pursued, all interactions must be documented by the Director (Complaint form), signed (by Director and or parties involved), and a copy given to each party concerned.

2.3 Any allegation that the safety, health, or wellbeing of a child has been compromised, or relating to a staff member, the details of action taken in response to a complaint will be recorded and kept in a confidential place.

3 Regulatory Authority - ACECQA

3.1 The Nominated Supervisor or Certified Supervisor will notify (within 24 hours of the complaint being made) ACECQA of a complaint that alleges

- a serious incident has occurred or is occurring while a child is being educated and cared for by Yarrunga.
- the National Law and/or National Regulations have been contravened.

The required Forms to be completed are;

Notification of Complaints and Incidents (Other than serious Incidents) as required by the Education & Care Services National Regulations – through the National Quality Agenda IT System (NQA IT System). Log in to access the portal.

A scanned copy of the written complaint will be uploaded prior to submitting the form electronically.
